Maurice D. Hinchey Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area

The Hudson River Valley is known for its natural beauty and cultural contributions to the American identity, including the role the region played in the revolution and the emergence of distinct artistic styles.

The Maurice D. Hinchey Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area (HRVNHA), which is managed by the Hudson River Valley Greenway (HRVG), celebrates the region's rich history and works to increase awareness of heritage sites that address themes of freedom, dignity, nature, culture, and commerce.

Grant Funding

Heritage Development Grants of up to \$7,500 are available for projects that recognize, preserve, protect, and interpret cultural and natural resources. Priority consideration is given to projects that create permanent or semi-permanent programming.

Eligibility

Municipalities and nonprofits within the National Heritage Area, which stretches from Yonkers to Troy, are encouraged to apply for competitive funding. Matching funds required.

Up to \$7,500 per project.
